

2026 Accessibility Guide

We have created this guide to help you make the most of your time at TOTFest Festival.

Before you arrive

Accessible Car Parking- The car park has some dedicated spaces for those who require one, please ask the car parking stewards to direct you to these on arrival.

Blue Badge holders should display their badge, in addition to complimentary car parking ticket and speak with stewards on arrival to be directed to an accessible parking space.

Important! Please note we anticipate there will be queues entering and exiting the car parks at peak times: 11:00-12:30 and 17:00-17:30, our stewards will do their best to always direct you as quickly and safely as possible. Please consider this when planning your day if you are unable to queue, particularly if you need to consider time-sensitive routines such as medication schedules.

Arriving at TOTFest Festival

Festival Site Terrain - TOTFest takes place at UK Racecourses, the sites are large and mostly flat, with a combination of grassed areas, connected by roads and concrete paths. On the festival field the terrain can be undulating in places, and depending on the weather in the lead up to the event it can become wet and muddy underfoot. Please bring anything you need to navigate the grounds comfortably.

All festival entrances are shown on the site map, which you can find on social media in the week leading up to each event, you will also be given one upon entry to the site. Every entrance has an accessible entry lane for customers who are unable to queue. Please ask a steward to direct you to the nearest accessible lane.

Our friendly entrance team are keen to provide information and support so please do say "Hi".

We recommend allowing plenty of time to arrive. To keep everyone safe, all attendees are required to go through routine bag searches completed by our Security team before having their tickets checked.

If you struggle with queuing due to a medical condition, please make yourself known to a member of our friendly entrance team, who will do their best to assist you.

Inside TOTFest Festival

Accessible toilets are available throughout the site, with at least one at every toilet block.

Our **Medical Team** is on site to help you as needed. You can find their location on the site map and visit them at any time throughout the festival; they can help with medical incidents.

Quiet Space & Sensory Space

The Festival wants to be a safe and happy place for everyone to enjoy. However, the size of the site and the large crowds mixed in with all the different sounds, lights, smells and experiences can be overwhelming especially for customers with mental health, emotional and sensory issues.

If you need a moment away from the busier festival areas, there are quiet and sensory spaces available:

We have a dedicated SEN Den. There are 3 quiet short performances within this space during the event, times can be found on the festival guide; however, the SEN Den is always open should you need some time to get away from the hustle and bustle of the event. The aim of this space is to provide a safe, low-level stimulation and recalibration zone for our neurodivergent Festival-goers

We also have a dedicated parenting room at every festival site. This space is equipped with chairs for feeding and is a quiet space for naps or taking time out to regulate during a busy day.
